
HOCKEY CANADA PLAYING RULE CHANGES FOR 2016-2018



"The action of tripping a player by knocking the player's skates out from behind with a kicking OR leg dragging motion "



Case Book Glossary Page 13



A player who slew foots an opponent shall be assessed a double Minor penalty and Game Misconduct if the infraction is committed while the offending player is stationary (not skating)

Note: Linesmen should report such infractions to the Referee (Reference HC RIC Memo 6 Sep 2016).

Rule 7.4(b)

A player who slew foots an opponent shall be assessed a **Match** penalty if the infraction is committed while the offending player is **in motion** (skating).

Rule 7.4(b)

As before, a **Match** penalty shall be assessed to any player who accidentally injures, <u>attempts to injure or deliberately injures</u> an opponent by slew footing **(while stationary or in motion).**

Rule 7.4(b)

INTERFERENCE WITH GOALTENDER

If an attacking player is in the goal crease illegally and another attacking player (who is outside the goal crease) scores, the goal shall be <u>allowed</u> <u>provided</u> the attacking player in the crease <u>does not</u>:

- attempt to play the puck, or
- interfere with the play, or
- obstruct the goaltender's view, or
- obstruct the goaltender's movements

Rule 7.3(b)

Goals - Net Tilted Forward

New Situation:

A goal is scored. However, the back of the net is lifted when the puck crosses the goal line. Is the goal allowed?

YES, if the net is still in/on its moorings.

LINESMAN AUTHORITY TO REPORT NOW INCLUDES:

- Slew Footing R7.4(b)*
- Player or goaltender illegally receiving stick R3.2 (b)(d)(e)
- Inciting an opponent R9.2(e)
- Verbal taunts, insults or intimidation based on discriminatory grounds R9.2(f)...

LINESMAN AUTHORITY TO REPORT NOW INCLUDES:

- Verbal abuse or physical gestures from the bench in protest of an official's ruling R9.2(i)
- Player on the ice throws stick or object but not at puck or puck carrier R9.8(c)
- Deliberately throwing stick out of playing area R9.8(d)

Rule 5.3(d)

PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

The reference to throat protectors has been removed from Rule 3.6 Situations 1, 4, 5 & 6....

The contradiction with Rule 3.6(f) has been eliminated

Rule 3.6 Situations 1, 4, 5 & 6

PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

When a player fails to wear <u>OR</u> properly wear a throat protector at any time on the ice during the game, the team shall receive one warning and any subsequent infractions by that team will result in Misconduct penalties...

Rule 3.6(f)

FACE-OFFS - STICK PLACEMENT

The players taking the face-off shall stand squarely facing their opponents' end of the rink...with the <u>TOE</u> of the blade of the stick on the ice...within the designated white area.

Rule 10.2(a)

MANDATORY GOALKEEPER EQUIPMENT

Helmet, Facial Protector certified for Goaltenders, Throat Protector and...

... (PeeWee and above) Goaltender Pads.

Rule 2.6 Sit 3

PLAYING RULE CHANGES - REVIEW

Slew-Footing:

- Stationary = 2 + 2 + GM
- In motion = Match
- Injury = Match
- Attempt to injure or deliberate injury = Match

Playing Rule Changes – Review

Goal with attacking player in goaltender's crease <u>allowed</u> provided the attacking player in the crease <u>does not</u>:

- > attempt to play the puck, or
- interfere with the play, or
- obstruct the goaltender's view, or
- obstruct the goaltender's movements

PLAYING RULE CHANGES - REVIEW

- Can score with net tilted forward if posts not displaced
- Linesmen authority: Can report 7 more infractions
- Case Book situations in synch with Throat Protector rule
- Goaltender Peewee & above: Must wear g/t leg pads
- > Face-off stick placement Toe of the blade on the ice
